Mons Soseman The need for speed. This desire was sublimated, perhaps, through much of human history. Speed was desired and admired, but seldom achieved. There is a passage in Hawthorn's "The House of the Seven Gables" in which the elderly brother and sister flee that house, and board an 1840's version of a train. They are terrified by the 6 mph speeds. The bicycle helped to slake that thirst for speed. Propelled on two wheels, people could go faster than ever thought possible. With chain and pedals, even better. Self shifting gears were a revelation. In the early years, that need for speed was carried out in Velodromes. Hundreds of thousands of people would go to see the cyclists pass by on a track at amazing speeds, and to watch them do so on a closed circuit. They were thrilled just to see the cyclists pass so fast, around and around. When that was not enough, they were thrilled to see the cyclists endurance, sometimes for 24 hours or more of cycling.

Mons Soseman Eventually, outdoor races became popular, as one day races, and eventually stage races became popular. The need for speed was

not completely fulfilled as humans pushed for fast, and as automobiles began to race, taking advantage of the roads paved at the urging of cyclists. The attention of those with that need for speed was transferred, first to motorized cycles, then to automobiles, especially when paved roads were completed and sufficient, or, 102 years ago, with the completion of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Fans content with watching speedy vehicles began watching auto races, and eventually Indy cars, Formula One, and NASCAR. The rate was much faster, the need was the same...

Mons Soseman Today, we fans of cyclists call a flat day, with riders going at a high rate of speed, a "paint drying day..." but this is not the case for spectators along the course, who are as thrilled to see the peloton pass as were the early fans of cycling. Especially in the case of a course through town, hardly thrilling to observe as a TV watcher, the constant passing of the peloton is exhilarating, and recalls the thrills of early fans of cycling, who had never seen such a thrilling thing in their lives. Expert fans can even follow the tactics being tested by cyclists and by teams within the peloton as they watch it pass by. Although we can follow those things in a macro way, as informed by TV hosts, too, the fan along the side of the road during these circuit stages can see what we might otherwise not see.
